Sofia



| Starter | For first-timers or very inexperienced riders, learning the basics of mounting and riding at a walk. |
| D-1 | For beginner riders who are comfortable with the walk and are learning the trot. |
| D-2 | For novice riders who are comfortable at the walk and trot and are learning the canter |
| D-3 | For novice riders who are comfortable at the walk, trot, and canter, and are beginning to carve out a specific discipline (showing can begin!) |
| C-1 | For intermediate riders comfortable in their discipline at a beginner level |
| C-2 | For intermediate riders comfortable in their discipline at an intermediate level |

Students level D-2 and higher are able to join Group Lessons! Not sure what level you are? Ask your instructor or take an evaluation lesson with us!

Shows and group lessons are a great way to grow your skills and get more involved in your riding! We recommend between 2 and 4 shows per year at a minimum once you get to D-3 Level, and the Platinum Package is a great way to get there! To ensure your success, you will be showing at a lower level than you are schooling in your lessons.

Advancing from the D-Levels to the C-Levels may mean that you will change instructors.

| Private Lessons | The lesson lasts 55 minutes, with the time being split between tack-up and untacking the horse before and after the lesson, and riding. The more experienced you get at grooming and tacking your horse, the longer you'll have to ride. |
| Group Lessons | The lesson lasts 1 hour and 15 minutes, including tack-up, riding, and un-tacking. These lessons include up to 4 members, and are in Western Horsemanship, English Equitation, and English Over-Fences classes. |
| Semester Commitment | <u>By signing up for lessons, you are committing to the full semester.</u> Programs cannot be “cancelled”, but may be transferred once to someone other than the original student. Students in one semester will be allowed early sign up for the next semester. Lessons do not roll over. |
| Membership | To enroll in lessons, you must have a family membership with the Riding Club, which renews yearly, and can be used for the whole family. These can be purchased by going to our website and clicking the “Join” tab. |
| Equipment Required | English Riders: An SEI-approved equestrian helmet, paddock or tall boots with a 1” heel, jodhpurs, breeches, riding tights, or jeans. Gloves recommended. Western Riders: An SEI-approved equestrian helmet, western boots with a 1” heel, jeans |
